BETWEEN TURNS

Tom and Gary talked about the hollowing systems that they use. Tom uses a captured d handle system. Gary uses a custom built two ended captured hollowing system. Jeff brought in his Don Derry captured hollowing system to look at. Like Gary's system Don's uses steel stock instead of round. The square stock provides a more rigid support for the tool, since a 1/2" steel bar has more steel in it than at 1/2" round bar.

A 12 foot cold rolled steal bar cost Gary under 45.00 and has a bit in each end. One end has a bit mounted straight and the other end has a bit mounted at 45 degree. An automotive light bulb is used to provide light. And a last light can be mounted at each end.

Tom's d handle system uses a metal support system that extends past the bed of the lathe. Gary's system uses a wooded capture with plastic runners.

Lyle Jamieson is one of the manufacturers of the d handle system. Check out his web site for more information. The clubs has several of his videos in the library.

The D-Handle capture system has a handle shaped like a "d" that spread the torque on the handle out to a wider area. Removing stress from the turner. I

Gary's system uses your lathes tool rest, a wooden capture system and an additional tool rest mounted past the cutting point. The stock extending past the cutting edge provides a place to hold the handle, and provides more support against the torque of the tool.

Gary can mount a HSS cutter bit or a scrapping bit for smoothing out the inside. A custom last system is adjustable, can be mounted at either end is used to help gauge the depth of the turning.

One of the ends also has a ruler drawn on it to help tell how deep you are turning.

Gary also built a custom steady rest use rollerblade wheels. This gives extra support for the turning.

It was nice seeing people going up and trying Tom and Gary's system. Having the opportunity to try new tools and techniques is something that is not always taken advantage of when demonstrators offer.

Gary had a great suggestion, when turning a green vase, he uses the small wrapping rolls on the outside the turning. These are basically small rolls of cling wrap. They provide a plastic barrier on the outside of the turning and help the piece dry form the inside and avoid splitting.































Not everyone in the club as tried a captured hollowing system before. They can remove some of the intimidation and strain of hollowing.

The club will be sponsoring some build days for members that are interested in building their own capture systems.








